Jubilee 2025 Pilgrims of Hope

December 29, 2024









On May 9, 2024 Pope Francis promulgated the decree, know as a "Bull of Indiction," for the Jubilee Year 2025, *Pilgrims of Hope*.

Following a tradition originating in the Hebrew Scriptures, the first Jubilee in the Catholic Church was proclaimed in the year 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII and has been continued from that time on to be held every 25 years.

Pope Francis, chose the motto "*Pilgrims of Hope*," for the Jubilee as the world is still in the midst of our post-pandemic years. Hope is the central message as indicated by the Latin title of the decree, "Spes non Copnfundit" (Hope does not disappoint").

Pope Francis notes that "the Jubilee has always been an event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church," encouraging all the faithful "to be tangible signs of hope."

Francis has cast the Jubilee as an opportunity for conversion, reconciliation with God through the sacrament of penance, obtaining indulgences for ourselves and the faithfully departed, through God's mercy, renewing our faith and love through hope, and proclaiming God's love to the many people suffering in today's world.

The pope's earnest desire is that the Jubilee Year may provide an opportunity in this year, "to be renewed in hope" not only for the millions of pilgrims who will travel to Rome for this Jubilee, but also for those who, unable to do so, will celebrate in their local churches through pilgrimages to Marian shrines and holy sites.

The Holy See made provision that persons who are unable to take part in physical pilgrimages or pious visits, such as cloistered religious, the elderly, the sick and their caretakers, or the imprisoned, may obtain the indulgence by uniting themselves in spirit with those who are making pilgrimage or pious visits, reciting an Our Father, a Profession of Faith, and other prayers in harmony with the purpose of the Jubilee Year, and offering up their sufferings and hardships to the Lord.

Usual Conditions for the Plenary Indulgence

1. Celebrate Sacramental Confession (going to Confession within 20 Days *before* or within 20 days *after* the indulgence is sought). A person should be of the spirit that is sincerely and willfully detached from any sin, mortal and venial. 2. Receive Holy Communion while participating fully, actively, and consciously at Mass. 3. Pray for the Pope's needs and monthly intentions: Apostles Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be.

Indulgence Conditions of Jubilee Year Pilgrims of Hope

◆Traveling to any sacred Jubilee designated site and perform the usual conditions; or engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation concluding with an Our Father, a Profession of Faith, and on invocations to Mary.

Perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy.

♦ Participate in a popular mission, spiritual exercise, or formational activities on the documents of Vatican II or the *Catechism* of the Catholic Church.

♦ Piously visit any sacred Jubilee site and participate in Mass, a Liturgy of the Word, one of the major hours from the Liturgy of the Hours (offiœ of Readings, Morning Prayer, or Evening Prayer), devotional prayers such as the Way of the Cross, the Rosary, or a penanœ serviœ that ends with sacramental Confession.
